EACH JUNIOR WILL MEET WITH MRS. BROCK TO PLAN.

Juniors may take as many as six days for college visits. We strongly encourage students to experience the varied college campuses to learn their preferences. This will help narrow down their search.

To plan a college visit, students should get a form from the office to plan their absence. This should be obtained ~ three days in advance in order to obtain all permissions necessary from teachers. The completed form should be submitted to the office at least one day before the scheduled visit. Be sure to pick up your College Tour Resource Guide in the office when planning your visit.

COLLEGE TESTING · SAT / ACT



Most colleges and universities require admissions exams. The SAT and the ACT are two standard tests that students take to help determine admission, scholarship, and placement. Students may take these tests mulitple times to accrue their best score. Some colleges may use a "Super-Score" technique where they take the best score from each section to formulate the student's submitted score.

PRACTICE TIPS

Online Practice

Both the SAT and the ACT websites provide great practice tools. Use them! Practice Books

Look at your favorite book store for practice workbooks. Repetition increases comfortlevel. Review Scores

Take the time to review your previous test scores and use the resources and tips provided.

Create a study plan and stick to it!

College applications open in August. Plan to begin the process early in your Senior year.
